## Camrose rcmp police report

Camrose County Council voted to host the RCMP crime map on the county's website for information about residents. The map shows the last 14 days of crime data that the general public can view. Crime mapping helps law enforcement by encouraging Albertans to participate in crime prevention strategies, such as reporting suspects or activity, in an effort to be the extra set of eyes and ears for the police in our community. Only certain types of crime will be presented on the map: Theft from motor vehicle; Theft of motor vehicles; Theft over / less than 5000 dollars; Break & enter; Mr Mischief; and missing persons. Some other important information to note: Emergency situation flag. Flags would only be used in emergency situations and for very short periods (School blockade, dangerous situation, evacuation, train derailment, etc.) - The addresses drawn will not be exact, but rather an intersection or a nearby road. Entries are on a template basis: only some information can be entered (such as file number and date) Entries will be automatically removed after 14 days. Clicking on the link below leads to the Camrose County area on the site, but you can scroll around the map and see other areas that are participating.
